## Workshop Supply List

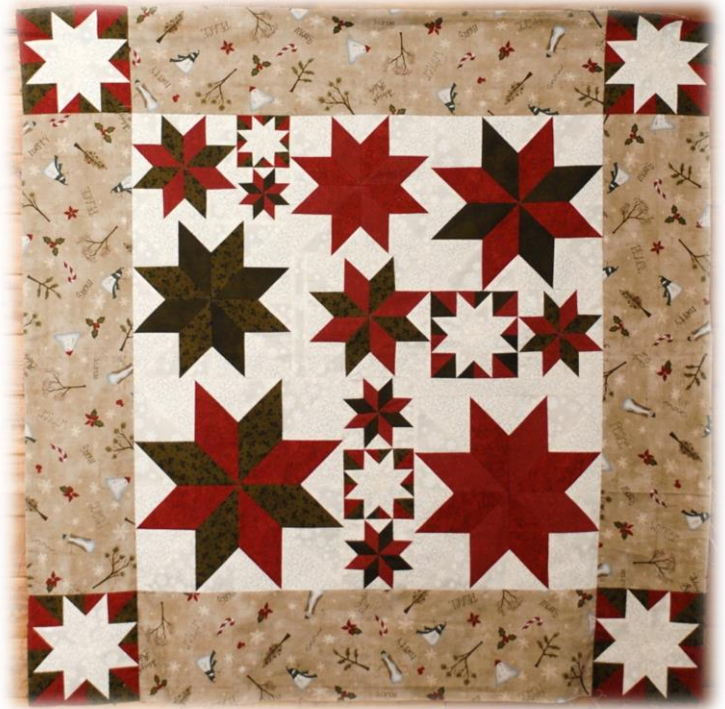
Get ready for a great new method for constructing traditional Lemoyne Star blocks. You'll be using strip piecing techniques, oversizing units for easy trim down and no "Y" seams. The Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star tool is designed to give you the choice of 10 different size blocks that range from 3" to 12" finished. This class project is a sampler of all of the sizes.

The purchase of the Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star™ tool is required for this class. It will be available at the workshop if you don't already have it.

Pre-cutting of strips is also required so that maximum time can be allotted to actual sewing and block construction. Please be prepared by having the listed precut strips ready for use.

### Basic Equipment:

- Sewing machine in **GOOD WORKING** order
- Neutral colored thread (tan, white or grey)
- New size sewing machine needle
- Rotary cutter (new blade suggested)
- Cutting Mat (12" X 18" suggested)
- Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star™ tool (available at workshop)
- Invisigrip for back of tool (not required but highly recommended -will be available for purchase)
- Tucker Trimmer™ I (not required but highly recommended– will be available for purchase)
- Tucker Trimmer™ III (not required but highly recommended – will be available for purchase)
- General sewing tools – scissors, seam ripper, pins, etc...



### Project Yardage & Precutting Requirements

37" X 37" wall quilt

I made mine from two reds, two greens and two different background fabrics. You may do the same or just choose 3 different colors – two star point colors and one background.

FABRIC	Yardage
Star Point	1/3 yd each, 1 1/3 yard total
Background	7/8 yd each, 1 3/4 yard total
Border and binding	1 yard

### Pre-Cutting For Class

**Star Point fabrics** (for each size strip, cut strips from 2 different fabrics, each size makes one size block)

- 2 strips- 2 3/4" X width of fabric
- 2 strips – 2" X width of fabric
- 2 strips – 1 1/2" X width of fabric

**Background fabrics** (if using 2 different fabrics, cut 1 strip from each fabric)

- 2 strips – 4 1/4" X width of fabric
- 2 strips – 3 1/4" X width of fabric
- 2 strips – 2 3/4" X width of fabric
