

# Migrating Geese

## Workshop Supply List

Learn a great method for making this technique that can be used for an entire quilt or as an interesting border.

The purchase of the Migrating Geese Technique sheet from Studio 180 Design is required for this class. It will be available at the workshop if you don't already have it.

Pre-cutting of strips is also required so that maximum time can be allotted to actual sewing and technique construction. Please be prepared by having the listed precuts ready for use.

### Basic Equipment:

Sewing machine in **GOOD WORKING** order  
Neutral colored thread (tan, white or grey)  
New sewing machine needle  
Erasable marking pen/pencil  
Rotary cutter (new blade suggested)  
Cutting Mat (12" X 18" suggested)  
General Rulers (12 ½" X 12 ½", 6' X 24" or 8 ½" X 24")  
Migrating Geese Technique Sheet (available at workshop)  
General sewing tools – scissors, seam ripper, pins, etc...



### Project Yardage & Pre-Cutting Requirements

The quilt pictured is 66" X 91" The yardages for this project are listed below. You can make any size project desired or just learn the technique. Directions to finish the above quilt will be provided at the workshop.

FABRIC	Yardage
Assorted Scraps, Geese	1 ½ yds total
Background	1 ⅝ yds
Lattice	1 ¾ yards
1 <sup>st</sup> Border	3/8 yd
Outer Border	1 ½ yds
Binding	⅝ yd
Backing	5 ½ yds

### Pre-Cutting For Class

#### Assorted scrap fabrics

10 – 5 ¼" squares, cut on **one** diagonal

#### Background fabrics (½ yd if just learning the technique)

20 – 4 ⅞" squares

1 – 2 ⅞" square
