Happy New Year! After roughly 18 months of recruiting and planning, 2019, the year of our show, is finally upon us. We have 13 vendors (with a waiting list), two raffle quilts, three raffle baskets, four guild speakers, demonstrations, free fat quarters, and our very popular Gift Gallery, containing member boutique items, as well as the best of the best donated mini-mart items.

The momentum is building and the 36 committee members are very excited. This is our guild's opportunity to shine and to let the public know who we are and what we love to do. We can showcase our personal quilting journeys, while sharing how and where we reach out in service to the greater community. The quilts in the show are meant to contain variety – of color choices, pattern, style, and skill level; of art or traditional preferences; of inspiration and expression; and of our common love of quilting. We've promised the public over 200 of them!

Our website <http://quiltinc.org> contains additional detailed information about the show, including photos of both raffle quilts on the home page. From the Quilt Show 2019 link, there are links to the quilt show flyer, registration information/forms, guild boutique information/forms, and a judging points form. There are also directions for walker bags and fidget quilts under the Gift Gallery link, in the hope that you'll consider making and donating these to be sold at the gift gallery.

Our lovely guild raffle quilt (a Judy Neimeyer pattern called *Solstice*), which was pieced, quilted, and donated by our own Virginia Zajesky, is shop hopping its way around the greater Capital District. It is currently at Log Cabin Fabrics through January 15, which will be followed by Joyful Quilter, Adirondack Quilts, and a final shop

before it wends its way to the show. (It reminds me of an Olympic torch!) Books of raffle tickets for both quilts are available at Virginia's table at guild meetings (near the back of the room). The tickets make great Valentine's Day or surprise pre-Easter gifts!

Our publicity committee has bookmarks for distribution. Please consider printing out the publicity flyer from the website and posting it in your local churches, libraries, medical offices, boutique shops, community bulletin boards, local pizzerias or delis, farmers' markets, and anywhere else you can think of. Help us to reach as many people as possible.

And lastly, please consider signing up to volunteer by stopping at the designated table at guild meetings. There are many and varied tasks for everyone to find a way to help (and receive a discount on admission to the show).

Some critical dates to remember: early bird quilt registration has passed, but regular quilt registration runs through January 11 (the date of our next meeting). Please don't miss this final registration date to turn in your forms, as no exceptions will be made. We want to include ALL of your quilts.

So, BE EXCITED! Our show is only three short months away, and there is no time to waste! Remember that quilts do not need to be completed by January 11, just photographed with best-guess measurements provided. Quilts will need to be completed by March 29.

Winter is a long, dark season – perfect for sewing! Please make items to sell in the Gift Gallery. The possibilities are endless: purses, bags, table runners, iPad or notebook covers, pot holders, lap quilts, wall hangings, pinch pouches, casserole carriers, fabric baskets, etc. You will keep 80% of the sale price. When you can't stand being inside anymore, and you venture out to area fabric stores and quilt shops, please consider using coupons to pick up sale items and donate them to the quilt show raffle baskets or Gift Gallery. And then when you're ready for spring cleaning, please gather some good quality fabric, patterns, books, or notions to donate from your stashes to the Gift Gallery (freeing up space for new purchases)! Lots of ways to be involved, lots of ways to help. It's our show, and the stars are the limit!

EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION DEADLINE: FRI., DEC. 14, 2018

EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION must be received by the Registration Committee before the end of the December 14, 2018, guild meeting or postmarked by December 14, 2018.

FINAL REGISTRATION DEADLINE: FRI., JAN. 11, 2019

All other registrations must be hand delivered or postmarked by Friday, January 11, 2019. Mail Registration Forms to Q.U.I.L.T., Inc., PO Box 523, Delmar, NY 12054-0523. If too many quilt registrations are received, registration date will be one of the criteria used to determine which quilts will be included in the show.

Include in your envelope:

A completed entry form for each item entered.

Form for each non-judged item (\$5 per item EARLY REGISTRATION; \$7 per item after Dec., 14, 2018)

Form for each judged item (\$10 per item EARLY REGISTRATION; \$12 per item after Dec., 14, 2018)

Registration Information
Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. – Quilt Show 2019 – Celestial Threads
Saturday, April 6 and Sunday, April 7, 2019

Each quilter may submit up to six (6) entries (quilts and wearable art). Of these six (6) entries, only four (4) may be entered for judging. Registration forms may be submitted (in person) or postmarked by Fri., January 11, 2019.

All quilts must be made by members of Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. Only quilts which have **NOT** been exhibited in prior Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. shows may be registered.

HINTS TO ASSIST IN FILLING OUT THE REGISTRATION FORM:

- **PRIORITY NUMBER (for displaying quilts):** Assign numbers to each item entered, starting with any “judged” items. For example, if I am entering 2 items for judging and 4 that will not be judged, I will number my judged items 1 and 2 and I will number my non-judged items 3, 4, 5, 6. (Remember that only 6 items may be entered in total and only 4 of those may be judged.) If too many quilt entries are received for display, the PRIORITY NUMBER, registration date, and size limitations will be used to eliminate quilts.
- **JUDGED AND NON-JUDGED QUILTS:** Any quilt is eligible for judging, including framed quilts. A judged or non-judged quilt consists of two or more layers that are joined together and quilted. Only 100 entries (quilts and wearable art combined) will be accepted for judging. If too many judged quilt entries are received, the PRIORITY NUMBER and registration date will be used to eliminate quilts.
- **JUDGED AND NON-JUDGED WEARABLE ART:** A judged or non-judged wearable art entry should include in its design, construction or embellishment one or more quilt techniques (piecing, appliqué, quilting, etc.) in some part of the garment. Batting or middle layer is not required.
- **SUBMISSIONS:** (judged and non-judged):
 - Submit a **separate registration form for each item** entered in the Show,
 - a 4”X6” photo of the entire quilt to help the display committee plan for the Show. Photo may be printed on plain printer/copier paper, trimmed to 4”X6”. *The following information must be on the back of each photo: your name, phone number, priority number, title of entry, and dimensions of quilt ___” wide ___”long.* Do not attach the photo with tape; use a paper clip or staple. *(All of your entries may be mailed in one envelope.)*
 - *agistra check for total amount due (only one check covering all submissions)*
 - *Self addressed stamped envelope(SASE) (only one SASE covering all submissions)*
- **All entries must be submitted or postmarked by Friday, January 11, 2019.** Due to arrangements for set-up, insurance, and preparation of the catalog, no exceptions will be made to the deadline. If you are still working on your quilt or wearable art and are reasonably confident about completing it by the **quilt delivery date (Friday, March 29, 2019 – Please NOTE: This is NOT a Q.U.I.L.T. Inc. monthly meeting date)**, submit your registration form by the January 11, 2019, deadline. Quilt delivery will be at the Delmar Reformed Church.
- **DISPLAY CARD INFORMATION:** (*Guide for brief description*) Keep your description to **35 words or less.** Include the following information:
 - a) Design/pattern source — Original (must be a new creation and not a copy of a previous work). If a pattern is used, list pattern information including magazine, book or workshop, project title and author/instructor.

- b) Technique — Pieced by hand or machine; appliquéd by hand or machine; mixed media, such as embroidery, beading, stamping, etc.
 - c) Interesting details—You might describe your inspiration; why you made the quilt and/or for whom; anything unusual/interesting back, etc.
 - d) Special details (used for displaying in the Show) — Identify Challenge quilts.
 - e) Details entered as part of the questions on the registration form, do not need to be repeated in the 35 word description.
- **LABELING, HANGING SLEEVES, PILLOWCASES, DELIVERY, PICKUP:** Information will be sent via your self-addressed stamped envelope after receipt of the Registration Forms. (NOTE: You need only send ONE stamped self-addressed envelope regardless of number of registration forms.) Sleeves must be at least 4” deep. **Quilts MUST be delivered in a cloth bag (one bag per quilt; NOT a PLASTIC bag); required labels MUST be present on the bag and on the quilt. Quilts delivered without a cloth bag or required labels will NOT be accepted.** Details will be mailed after registration ends.
 - **FEES:** There is an entry fee for each non-judged item and for each judged item. If the committee finds it necessary to further limit the number of entries, your entry fee for that item will be returned to you. Entry fees for EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION are: \$5 per non-judged item and \$10 per judged item. **EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION FORMS must be postmarked by Fri., Dec., 14, 2018, or hand-delivered at the guild meeting on Fri., Dec. 14, 2018.** After that, entry fees for non-judged items will be \$7 per entry and entry fees for judged items will be \$12 per entry. All registration forms must be postmarked or hand delivered by Fri., Jan 11, 2019. Mail registration forms to Q.U.I.L.T., Inc., PO Box 523, Delmar, NY 12054-0523.
 - **INSURANCE:** Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. will provide security and insurance from the time your entry is in our possession until the item is signed out after the Show. The maximum for which an item may be insured is \$1,000, unless you have an appraisal or sales record documenting a higher value. The amount paid for a loss, without an appraisal or sales slip will be determined by the insurance company, based on a recent sales record of an item of like kind and quality. All exhibitors should have a high-quality, full shot of the entry and a close-up shot of details of the entry in case of loss. Since our cost for this insurance depends on the total value of the insured items, we ask that you carefully estimate the value of your entry. While Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. will make every effort to protect your entry, it will be your responsibility to validate any insurance claim with the insurance company.
 - **MAXIMUM QUILT SIZE:** 116” wide by 140” long. We will have a limited number of these very large spaces.
